
Heroin Addiction Treatment



What is Heroin?

Heroin is an opioid, which the creators make from morphine. Morphine is a natural substance that occurs in the poppy plants in Mexico, Columbia, and



Southeast and Southwest Asia. Heroin can appear as a brown or white powder. It can also appear as a black, sticky substance, which dealers call black tar heroin.

When a person uses heroin, it quickly enters the brain and binds to the opioid receptors. These opioid receptors control the feelings of pain and pleasure and manage your ability to sleep, breathe, and your heart rate. Your brain quickly forgets how to produce pleasurable sensations on its own, causing you to want to go back to using heroin.

Unfortunately, heroin causes a variety of adverse side effects, including:

- Infection of the heart lining and valves
- Collapsed veins, if you inject the substance
- Liver, kidney, and lung disease
- Abscesses in the tissue
- Slowed mental functioning
- Heightened risk of bloodborne pathogens if you inject heroin

In addition, because there is no regulation of heroin creation, many of the people who create heroin add other substances to this already dangerous mix. These additives, like starch, sugar, or powdered milk, can clog your blood vessels and impair your body's ability to function. It is imperative that you seek addiction treatment as soon as possible to avoid the long-term consequences of heroin use.
